

7-11's Arty Party Event



This activity based forum is part of the new Children in Care Council model. It was attended by 30, 7-11's during the Christmas Holidays. Ambassadors worked with the Permanence Team to plan the activities and questions they wanted to ask children. The Fostering Support Team were on hand to offer foster carers a cup of tea and a catch up while their children had fun making Christmas decorations and playing games.

Key messages from the children:

- They had an idea about what their Social Worker does, to check that they are okay and safe - "Helps me and talks to me"
- They did not always know what their meetings were, the names of their meetings (e.g. Personal Education Plan or Children in Care Review)
- They would like to go out to places with their Social Workers (e.g. McDonalds, to the park or walk the dog)
- They would like their Social Workers to bring things to do, e.g. arts and crafts, colouring, play games and be fun.



Children in Care meet Corporate Parents

15 members of the Children in Care Council (the largest group so far), hosted the third event with Corporate Parents at the University of Gloucestershire during October half term. The two main themes were debating priority actions for the new Aspirations Strategy and celebrating care leaver's successes as it was National Care Leavers Week. It was an inspiring event with lively discussion about what young people think we are doing well and what are the areas that need more work. Their ideas have been incorporated into 'Aspirations for children and young people in Our Care and Care Leavers' 2017-20.
