# Permanently extend the age range of St James' & Ebrington C of E Primary School from 4-11 to 2-11 years from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2022

Notice is given in accordance with section 19(1) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 and the School Organisation (Prescribed Alterations to Maintained Schools) (England) Regulations 2013 that Gloucestershire County Council intends to make a prescribed alteration to St James' & Ebrington C of E Primary School, Pear Tree Close, Chipping Campden, GL55 6DB from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2022.

The proposal seeks approval to permanently extend the age range of St James' & Ebrington C of E Primary School from 4-11 to 2-11 years from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2022.

The current capacity at the school is 210 and the PAN is 30. The current number of pupils registered at the school is 134.

### Explanatory notes
