Dear Mr Normington,

I am writing as the Planning Consultant for Stowe Hill Quarry, on behalf of Breedon Southern Limited (Breedon) who operate this quarry. An extension of Stowe Hill Quarry for hard rock aggregate extraction is proposed in Allocation 01 of the Gloucestershire Minerals Local Plan (GMLP). As a result of this proposed allocation, Breedon and I have supported that soundness of the GMLP.

Nevertheless, GCC have issued an Addendum to the Supporting Evidence Paper dated December 2018. Here, GCC are proposing that Allocation 01 should be deleted from the GMLP. It is our view that the site issues for Allocation 01 can be addressed and that it's deletion will

result in hard rock aggregate supply issues. We also did not have the opportunity to make any representation to the December 2018 Addendum, for what we consider will result in a significant change to the deliverability of the GMLP.

Our position has therefore changed from one of support to objection and we request the opportunity to attend the hearing to support the retention of Allocation 01. If this is acceptable, I would also like the opportunity to provide a statement outlining our concerns.
