Statement of Representation Procedure and Availability of Documents

The purpose of this statement is to demonstrate how Regulation 18 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 and Part 2, Section 19 (3) of the Planning & Compulsory Purchase Act 2004¹, are being complied with.

Title of the local development plan document under consideration:

Draft Minerals Local Plan for Gloucestershire (2018-2032)

The subject matter of and areas covered:

Gloucestershire County Council has published a Draft Minerals Local Plan for Gloucestershire (2018-2032) for consultation with all 'specific' and 'general' consultation bodies as identified in the adopted Gloucestershire Statement of Community Involvement (SCI)², and with other parties and individuals contained on the County Council's main list of consultees. Those present on the main list have previously made comments on earlier consultation activities and / or have expressed an interest to be notified of future planning policy-related consultations undertaken by the Council – including the preparation of the minerals local plan.

The Draft Minerals Local Plan for Gloucestershire (2018-2032) seeks to provide a planning policy framework for minerals development throughout the county over a 15-year period between 2018 and 2032. It comprises of a long term vision for Gloucestershire in the context of minerals planning; a suite of seven strategic objectives; a mineral planning strategy; ten allocations for future aggregate working with individual detailed development requirements, and policies to support: - secondary & recycled aggregates, mineral safeguarding, the supply of minerals, the function of the allocations for future aggregate working, mineral restoration and development management matters.

Once adopted, the Minerals Local Plan for Gloucestershire (2018-2032) will replace in its entirety, the existing adopted minerals local plan, which has been in use since 2003. Its primary function will be to guide decisions on planning applications for minerals development over the plan period.

Period of invitation to make representations:

The adopted Gloucestershire Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) commits the County Council to undertake consultation on plan-making matters for a period of at least six weeks, but wherever possible to extend this to eight weeks³. As a consequence the Draft Minerals Local Plan for Gloucestershire (2018-2032) and supporting documents will be available to view and comment upon from **29th September 2016** through to **5pm on 24th November 2016**.

It is strongly recommended that comments are made to the County Council within the consultation time period advised so as to ensure they will be taken into account in the future preparation of Minerals Local Plan for Gloucestershire.
